The Rubik Ensemble is the first European Ensemble formed by six international renowned soloist prize winners of the most prominent musical institutions. Unconventional, revolutionary and versatile, The Rubik Ensemble takes the name from the invention of the Hungarian mathematician Ernő Rubik, who created a puzzle cube formed by six faces of six different colours. By mixing this six different faces in different formulas they end up being "the perfect match"

Our essence is born from the versatility created by mixing the musicianships of each one of the six members of the Rubik Ensemble. This is what creates our identity, uniqueness is our Keyword. Developed and mixed through music in the same way than a Rubik Cube system we create musical programs always in different combinations that will go from solo performances until duet, trio, quartet, quintet or sextet. This is our soul and our "perfect harmony"

The Rubik Ensemble symbolises an union between countries through music. We come from six different countries: Russia, France, Belgium, Spain, Netherlands and Germany. We are all connected and developed in this ensemble from different parts of the world to open to all kinds of public classical music and wonderful musicians.

Nikita Boriso-Glebsky, violin (Russia)

After winning top prizes at Sibelius Competition, Tchaikovsky, Kreisler and Queen Elisabeth Competition, Nikita has performed with many major orchestras, under such conductors as Valery Gergiev, Sakari Oramo, David Afkham, etc.

Solenne Païdassi, violin (France)

Winner of the Frist Prize of the Long-Thibaud Competition (2010), she has been awarded many prizes including Hannover Competition and Gyengnam Competition (Korea). She has played as soloist in venues such as Tonhalle Zürich, Concertgebouw Amsterdam, Carnegie Hall in New York, etc.

Dana Zemtsov, viola (Netherlands/Russia)

Winner of numerous competitions, she developed an outstanding career. Recent highlights include Bartok Viola Concerto at Concertgebouw, chamber music with Janine Jansen, Martin Frost, etc.

David Cohen, cello (Belgium)

He has won more than 25 prizes in International Cello Competitions. He has worked with conductors such as Mstislav Rostropovich, Vladimir Ashkenazy, Christoph von Dohnányi, Sir Charles Mackerras, etc.

Uxía Martínez Botana, contrabass (Spain)

She was selected by the American bass magazine "No treble" as one of the world top 10 bass players; in 2016 she was named "Artist of the Year" in Japan. She works usually with artists such as Daniel Barenboim, Marta Argerich, Emmanuel Pahud, Khatia Buniatishvili, Nelson Freire, among many others.

Andreas Hering, piano (Germany)

He has won several prizes, such as International Max Reger competition, Beethoven Competition Richard Laugs in Mannheim. He as been invited to play with orchestras such as Kölner Philharmoniker and Festivals such as Meckelnburg-Vorpommern.
